Professor Finkin is the Albert J. Harno and Edward J. Cleary Chair in Law at the University of Illinois in Urbana-Champaign. His teaching centers on labor and employment law. He is the author or co-author of nine books, including *For the Common Good: Principles of American Academic Freedom* (Yale U. Press 2009) and the award-winning *The Case for Tenure* (Cornell U. Press 1996). Professor Finkin serves as a General Editor of the *Comparative Labor Law & Policy Journal* and on the editorial boards of several professional periodicals. Professor Finkin has taught at Southern Methodist University, Duke University, and the University of Michigan. He has been a Fulbright Professor at Münster University and a German Marshall Fund Lecturer at Konstanz University. For over four decades he has been active in the American Association of University Professors, including service as General Counsel, Chair of Committee A on Academic Freedom and Tenure, and on numerous committees.
